Apostolos Fasianos is an assistant professor with a focus on empirical macroeconomics. He lectured at Brunel University London and explores the macroeconomic implications of household financial behaviour the economic impact of artificial intelligence. His research projects have been funded by prestigious national and international funding bodies including the Hellenic Foundation for Research and Innovation (ELIDEK) and the British Academy. His teaching and learning support practices have been recognized in Great Britain and he has been awarded the Higher Education Fellowship.

In the past, Apostolos has worked as an economist at the Council of Economic Advisors of the Hellenic Ministry of Finance and the Irish Economic Analysis Division at the Central Bank of Ireland. He has also been involved in research projects run by the Bank of England and the Reserve Bank of New Zealand on topics related to household finances and macroeconomics.

He has represented Greece in international fora including the EPC – Ageing Working Group committee (AWG) at the European Commission and the Working Party 1 on Macroeconomic and Structural Policy Analysis at the OECD.

Apostolos holds a PhD in Economics from the University of Limerick, an MSc in Economic Development from the University of Glasgow, an MPhil in Economic Theory from the University of Athens, and a BSc in Economics from Democritus University of Thrace.

His research interests include macroeconomic policy, household finances, housing economics, monetary economics, inequalities, and political economy.
